Meanwhile at the **Tavi 5k Tim Steere** had a terrific run to finish 4th in 18.43, whilst **Barry Neal** was 16th and achieved a pb time of 20.19.

GALLERY: Tavistock's Walker continues winning fell running form at Ivybridge Three Tops Race

TAVISTOCK AC's Charlotte Walker claimed another fell running victory on Wednesday night as she won the Ivybridge Three Tops Race.

Despite still being a junior, Walker has dominated the female category in this year's South West Fell Running Series and had already won at Meldon, Langstone Coronation, Buckland Bounder, Summer Solstice, Cosdon Hill and Postbridge Pootle before Wednesday's win.

She took victory in the tough Ivybridge race by more than two minutes, with Headington's Tilly Woods second and Cornwall AC's Chloe Clarke third.



The men's race was won by Exmouth's Sam Kelly, who powered home in a quick time of 42.58 minutes. Second place went to Exeter Harriers junior Ben Perry, with Tom Perry third, Luke Roberts fourth and veteran Ceri Rees fifth and first M50. The race on Dartmoor, which is roughly 10k, starts with athletes running up Western Beacon, which towers above Ivybridge, before then heading up to Weatherdon and Glasscombe Ball and then up Ugborough Beacon before heading back to Ivybridge Rugby Club.



Last year's winner **Matthew Gilvear** of host club **Erme Valley** was chasing Kelly and Perry down Western Beacon when he took nasty fall and cut and damaged his knee. He did manage to pick himself up and get back to the finish, but he was overtaken by five athletes to finish eighth.

Gilvear had finished third and first junior a few days early at the Totnes 10k.

Tavistock's Charlotte Walker also ran the Totnes 10k and came second overall and first junior. Her sister, Hannah, was second junior.

Storm's Charlene Matthews was first F35, while **Erme Valley Harriers' Kate Medlicott** (**F55**), **Alison Engledew (F65) and Ronnie Haynes (M40)** all won age category titles, as did Tavistock's Allan Herdman (M70).

Meanwhile, Tavistock Run Project's Jim Cole produced a strong run to win the Indian Queens Half Marathon.

Cole, now in the M40 category, clocked 1:13.13 to finish nearly a minute-and-a-half ahead of second-placed Tom Morton of Mile High.

Erme Valley Harriers' youngster Charlie Milward made his debut over the half marathon distance and finished 17th in a strong field in 1:23.36.

City of Plymouth's Maczugowski enjoys double gold success at Nuneaton, while Erme Valley win relay event

CITY of Plymouth's Nicolas Maczugowski continued his impressive season by winning two gold medals at the Midland Counties AA Championships in Nuneaton at the weekend.

The English Schools' international triumphed in both the under-17 boys' 400m hurdles and 400m flat.

In windy conditions, he clocked 56.83 seconds to take the hurdles title by more than three seconds.

The following day, he then clocked 50.62 seconds to claim gold in the one lap flat race by more than two seconds.

Maczugowski is ranked second in the UK in the under-17 400m hurdles and has claimed the English Schools' Championship silver medal and the SIAB International silver medal and has also won the South West Schools' title and South West Inter-Counties title this season.

At the South of England Championships at Lee Valley, City of Plymouth's Adam Dingley won a bronze in the under-17 boys' 100m hurdles event.

Dingley is ranked joint second in the UK rankings and he showed his form in the heats, winning in 13.32 seconds. However, in the final he was just edged out by the

UK number one and number three ranked athletes. Dingley had just returned from Mallorca where he had been training hard at the Magaluf Athletics Track.

Meanwhile, **Erme Valley Harriers** enjoyed success at the South Devon 3k Relays event at the Torbay Velopark in Paignton.

Their team of Jamie Frost, Charlie Milward, Peter Allen and Luke Hayes took victory by 29 seconds.





They clocked 38 minutes and 37 seconds, with Teignbridge Trotters second and Torbay Tri third.

Plymouth Harriers' team of Matthew Cundell, Nathan Tall, Chris Hedges and David Morris came fifth, with **Erme Valley's** M40 quartet of **Ronnie Haynes, Tom Davies, Chris Prall** and **Tim Steere** finishing sixth and second veteran team. **Frost** ran the fast leg, clocking nine minutes and 13 seconds.

















