Charlene Shorey was 13th senior and first F40, with Tavistock's Hannah Worth second F40.

Tavistock Run Project's Rachael Malthouse was first F35, with Plymouth Harriers pair of Michelle Cooper and Rebecca Gilham second and third.

**Erme Valley Harriers' Emma Lake** was first F45, with Tavistock's Caroline Stevens first F55 and Tamar Trotters' Jane Bremner first F60. Plymouth Harriers' Jane Allison (F50) and Tavistock's Carole Walters (F60) were third in their age categories.

City of Plymouth AC came third in the women's team event, with Tavistock and Plymouth Harriers second and third in the veterans' team section.



The under-17 girls and boys both ran with the senior women. City of Plymouth had four athletes inside the top eight of the under-17 girls' race. Molly Shorey was third, Holly Reid fourth, Molly Gilbey seventh and Bella May eight.

In the under-17 boys' race, Tavistock's Fynn Baker came fourth. Fellow Tavistock athlete Hennessey held off a strong finish by Taunton's Edward Salter to win the under-13 boys' race by two seconds.
