Nearly 300 runners braved freezing conditions to take part in the race, which is organised by the Plymouth Round Table and has been going for nearly 20 years. The race starts and finishes at the Plymouth speedway track at Marsh Mills and takes runners into the Saltram estate.

Teenager Dee stormed home for victory in a time of 34 minutes and 25 seconds. Second place went to City of Plymouth's Matthew Bradley (M35), who finished strongly to clock 35.04 minutes.



James Dwyer was third in 35.15 minutes, with Chris Casey fourth (36.57) and Storm Plymouth's Daniel Westlake fifth (37.00).

There was a good battle in the masters age groups, with Tavistock Run Project's Raymond Tew, Tamar Trotters' Peter Waumsley and Plymstock Road Runners' Graham Bale all finishing next to each other in seventh, eighth and ninth places. Tew was first M50 in a time of 38.06 minutes, with Waumsley second in that age category in 38.17 and Bale, first M55, in 38.18.



Tavistock AC's Kelly won the women's race by more than two minutes. She clocked 39.01 minutes for the tricky multi-terrain course.

Second woman was Storm's Charlene Matthews in 41.11 minutes, with New Forest teenager Lilly Jones third (43.51), Suzanne Spooner fourth (44.37) and Plymstock's Jemma Phillis fifth (45.07).

TAVISTOCK AC'S Charlotte Walker continued her impressive form by claiming her first Westward League Cross Country win on Sunday at Westward Ho! After claiming the South West Inter-County Championship under-20 title last weekend, Walker stormed to victory in the senior women's race in north Devon by nearly a minute. She clocked 18.45 minutes for the race, with Exeter University's Inca Padfield taking second in 19.32 minutes and Tavistock AC's Jo Meek finishing third overall and first F45 in 19.34 minutes.

City of Plymouth's Molly Shorey was sixth overall and second under-17 athlete, with her team-mate Bella May sixth in the U17 category.

There was a good run in the senior men's race by **Erme Valley Harriers'** under-20 athlete **Matthew Gilvear.** He finished second overall behind Exeter University's Mark Ruby.

Plymouth Harriers' Johnny Gilby was seventh and first M40, with Tavistock AC's Ben Neale just behind in eighth.

City of Plymouth had both winners of the under-11 age group.

Lucas Sweeney backed up his win at Exeter in December by also winning at Westward Ho!

His team-mates Jack Penney and Jacob Sweeney were fifth and sixth and Tavistock's Arthur Moyse was eighth.

City of Plymouth and Tavistock AC filled all the top 10 places in the under-11 girls' race in north Devon.

Daisy Elliot took victory by seven seconds ahead of Tavistock's Evie Welsh. Tavistock's Olivia Walkerdine was third, City of Plymouth's Margot Goodspeed, Genevieve Stone and Theia Jones were fourth, fifth and sixth, respectively, Tavistock's Fearne Brogden was seventh, with City of Plymouth's Harper Linney-Goodall, Tilly Day and Evie Bolt filling the rest of the top 10 places.

In the under-13 girls' race, City of Plymouth's Elsie Goodspeed claimed second place, with team-mate Ayla Orgacki sixth.

There was also a second place finish for Tavistock AC's Connor Duffin in the under-15 boys' age group.

In the under-13 boys' age group, City of Plymouth's Finley Eales came fourth, with Tavistock's Thomas Hennessy and Freddie Whybrow fifth and sixth and City of Plymouth's Taylan Jones eighth.

In the under-17 boys' race, Tavistock's Noah Reid was fifth, while team-mate Anya McAulay came seventh in the under-15 girls' event.

ATHLETICS: Ivybridge's Gilvear claims title at Devon Schools' Cross Country Championships

MATTHEW Gilvear, Charlotte Walker, **Luke Hayes** and Zoe Bigham all won medals at the Devon Schools' Cross Country Championships at Exeter.

Ivybridge Community College's **Gilvear** won the senior boys' title at Exhibition Fields by 18 seconds.

His school and **Erme Valley Harriers' team-mate Charlie Milward** just missed out on a medal in fourth, with DHSOB's Ewan Dix fifth and Mount Kelly's Lorenz Baumgarter eighth.

Tavistock College's Charlotte Walker took silver in a strong senior girls' race just behind Colyton's England Schools' international Scarlett Livingstone.

In a good race, just 30 seconds separated the top four, with Plymouth College's Molly Shorey just finishing out of the medals in fourth. Plymouth High's Molly Gilby was sixth, Tavistock's Hannah Walker sevenths and Ivybridge's Bella May eighth. Devon should have a strong senior girls' team at both the South West and English Schools' Championships as they also have European under-20 cross country champion Innes Fitzgerald to come into the team. She missed the Devon Championships as she was competing – and winning – at the British Athletics Cross Challenge at Parliament Hill.

Ivybridge Community College's **Hayes** claimed the bronze medal in the intermediate boys' race.

DHSG's Bigham also won a bronze medal. Her top-three finish came in the junior girls' race. Tavistock's Lamorna Cox (5^{th}) and her school team-mate Elsie Goodspeed (6^{th}) were not far behind in that race.

There were top eight finishes for Tavistock College's Lara Dix $(5^{\text{\tiny th}})$ and Anya McAuley $(7^{\text{\tiny th}})$ in the intermediate girls' race and one for Mount Kelly's Jack Anthony $(8^{\text{\tiny th}})$ in the minor boys' race.

Meanwhile, Tamar Trotters' Bex Ezra-Ham finished second at the Storm Force 10 on Sunday in Camborne.

The event was the opening race in the 2024 Cornish Grand Prix.

Ezra-Ham clocked 59 minutes and 46 seconds. She was just beaten by Truro's Anna Harrold. Her club colleague Linda Tout was first F70 in 1:40.23.

Adam Holland came fourth overall in the men's race and first M35, while Tavistock Run Project's Alex Peyton-Jones was second M40. Tamar Trotters' Steve Baker was first M65, while team-mates Crispin Brabner (3rd, M50) and Richard Morton (2nd, M70) also were also in the prizes.

Elsewhere, Mark Budge took victory at the Tavy 5k on Saturday in 16.17 minutes. Second place went to City of Plymouth's Matthew Bradley (16.59), with Tavistock AC's Corin Russell third (17.51). Richard Drage came seventh and set a new age category record for M65 with a 19.12 minute run.

Harriet Silvester (U11) was first female in 23.22 minutes, with Tamar Trotters' veteran Jane Bremner second in 23.37 minutes, which was a new F65 age record.



Smart claims BUCS medal, while Reid wins bronze at South West Schools' Cross Country Championships

TAVISTOCK Run Project's Oliver Smart produced a strong run at Temple Newsam in Leeds on Saturday to claim the bronze medal in the men's long course race at the BUCS Cross Country Championships.

Smart helped the University of Birmingham to a clean sweep of the medals and the team prize, with his team-mates Will Barnicoat, the European U23 cross country champion, and Tomer Tarragona finishing first and second.

Smart had come fourth the previous year in the men's short course race at Greenford.

Temple Newsam is clearly a venue he enjoys running at as it was where he won the intermediate boys' race at the English Schools' Cross Country Championships in 2019.

The English Schools' Championships will again be in West Yorkshire this year, taking place at Pontefract on March 16.

A number of Armada athletes will head to that event in confident mood after impressing at the South West Schools' Cross Country Championships at RNAS Merryfield at the weekend.



City of Plymouth's Holly Reid, representing Cornwall, claimed the bronze medal in a strong senior girls' race which was won by European U20 champion Innes Fitgerald. Tavistock's Charlotte Walker was just behind in fifth place as Devon easily won the team prize with three athletes in the top five and four in the top nine. The county's strength in depth in that age group should give them a chance of medalling at the English Schools' Championships.

Erme Valley and Ivybridge Community College athlete Matthew Gilvear continued his strong season with a sixth-placed finish in the senior boys' race. Team-mate Luke Hayes just missed out on the top 10 in the intermediate boys' race, finishing 12th, while DHSG's Zoe Bigham (11th) and Elsie Goodspeed (14th) were both in the top 15 of the junior girls' race and Tor Bridge's Finley Eales (13th) was also in the top 15 of the minor boys' race.
